The California and Nevada Tribal Transportation Training and Technical Assistance Program (CA/NV TTAP) invites you to attend a **Tribal—State Consultation Training for Tribal Leaders, Tribal Administrators/Managers/Planners and Tribal Transportation Personnel.**

**Day One**

This training will provide an overview of the fundamental powers of Indian tribes and how the authority of tribes create and enforce laws; enter into government-to-government relationships; develop tribal business organizations and tribal jurisdiction over non-Indians in Indian country.

**Day Two**

This training will introduce you to the process of including the tribal governments with the planning and decision making of transportation activities that affect which tribal communities. We will discuss CALTRANS Director's Policy #19; through consultation establishes and engages CALTRANS in a the government-to-government relationship with federally recognized tribes, unrecognized tribes and individual Indians living off reservations. We will review California Senate Bill 18(S.B.18) you will discuss the purpose of finding ways to protect and preserve cultural places of California Tribal Communities. We will also examine the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966.
