Tools To Protect Sacred Lands and Monitor Cultural Resources

Beginning April 10, 2013, NIJC will conduct a training session on **Protecting Sacred Sites & Monitoring Cultural Resources**. This session delivers the legislative and policy tools to prevail over challenges many Tribes and others face in protecting sacred sites and other culturally important resources. The training also provides an introduction to monitoring at road construction, energy development and other projects to ensure that mitigation measures are implemented and cultural resources are protected. Case examples will be discussed. Participants will receive a comprehensive reference manual and certificate of achievement upon completion of the course.

This training focuses on the practical and effective implementation of federal and state laws (including case law) and policies with particular emphasis on:

- ▶ The American Indian Religious Freedom Act
- ▶ The National Historic Preservation Act
- ▶ The Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act
- ▶ The California Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act
