Protecting Tribal Sovereignty

The National Indian Justice Center (NIJC) will conduct a training session on Federal Indian Law on November 29– December 1, 2017. This training session will benefit the stewards of tribal sovereignty including tribal government officials, tribal councils, tribal court personnel and tribal police officers. This training offers practical advice on protecting tribal sovereignty in light of recent negative opinions by the U.S. Supreme Court. It examines the status of sovereign immunity, tribal civil and criminal jurisdiction, adjudicatory v. regulatory jurisdiction and Indian gaming issues.

This session is essential for new tribal council members and others vested with the duty to administer tribal government programs. Each participant will receive a comprehensive training manual and a certificate of achievement.
